

THE BREAKFAST CLUB FOR SINGLES 50+

POLICY TITLE: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AT TBC ACTIVITIES

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this policy is to minimize liability for The Breakfast Club for Singles 50+ (TBC) by not providing or serving alcoholic beverages, but not to prohibit alcohol at TBC activities unless specifically required by a facility use permit. TBC is neutral on the position of alcohol use.

The policy provides host(s)/coordinator(s) guidance on how much responsibility they have to protect the image and purpose of TBC and what actions to take when a violation occurs or when someone becomes unruly.

- a) TBC will not purchase and/or provide alcoholic beverages to any member(s) or guest(s) at any activity.
- b) Cash bars or individual member(s) or guest(s) provided alcoholic beverages may be available as permitted by a facility.
- c) Member(s) or guest(s) who provide or consume alcohol at facilities that prohibit alcohol do so at their own risk and assume all liability for violation, including damages to TBC or its members.
- d) Unless specifically required by the facility use permit, TBC activity host(s)/coordinator(s) are not responsible for enforcement of a No Alcohol Policy.
- e) If member(s) or guest(s) violate a No Alcohol Policy which requires TBC enforcement, the activity host(s)/coordinator(s) shall ask that the violation cease or request the member(s) or guest(s) to leave.
- f) If member(s) or guest(s) become unruly because of alcohol use or not, permitted or not, the activity host(s)/coordinator(s) shall ask the member(s) or guest(s) to cease such behavior to protect TBC members, TBC's image and reputation for providing safe and comfortable settings for activities. If the member(s) or guest(s) refuse to cease or leave, the host(s)/coordinator(s) shall not make or allow any effort to physically remove the persons(s). The host(s)/coordinator(s) shall issue a verbal warning that law enforcement will be called if the person(s) does not cease or leave. If the person(s) does not then cease the behavior or leave the activity, the host(s)/coordinator(s) must call law enforcement.
